Please know that the Trimester 2 teacher completed the report card but your child's Trimester 3, or current teacher's name is shown on the report card. Attendance will NOT be listed on the report card. Starting tomorrow, your child's report card will be available to view in the Aeries Parent Portal. After you log in you will see directions on how to view your child's report card. If your primary language is Spanish you should be able to see the report card in both Spanish and English. ## **Important Information**

Travel Guidance: As of today, <u>SMC Health (SMCH)</u> current travel guidance is as follows: Residents are urged to follow the State of CA's travel guidelines (<u>CDPH Travel Advisory</u>, <u>Jan 6</u>, <u>2021</u>) which are still in effect: "Californians should remain local (not traveling more than 120 miles from their home or other place of residence) and avoid non-essential travel." This guidance has not changed as San Mateo County moved to the Orange Tier on Wednesday, March 17. <u>SMCH Safety Guidelines for Travel</u> recommend that all individuals who travel over 120 miles from home, especially by air, bus, train or other mass transit, should consider quarantining at home for 10 days upon their return. It is also advised that they receive a COVID test before and after traveling. Many staff and families have followed this guidance and we appreciate their help in keeping everyone safe at school.

Run for Hope: Menlo Church will provide up to \$150,000 to people facing housing insecurity with rental relief due to COVID. Many of our students and families have been adversely affected and struggled to pay their rent. By participating (part of physical education, sport team, clubs, classes), Menlo Church will give funds to Samaritan House and two other nonprofits so they can provide rental assistance to families in need. As a way to feel empowered and help each other at this time, please consider signing up for Run for Hope. Everyone is welcome! No matter the age. Wherever you are. You don't have to attend Menlo, and you can walk/run/stroll/skip over a period of days (not just one day) from March 26-28. Run for Hope is free for participants, and Menlo will donate \$25 for every mile up to 150k. So invite your friends, cohorts, students, and family.
